Stained Glass

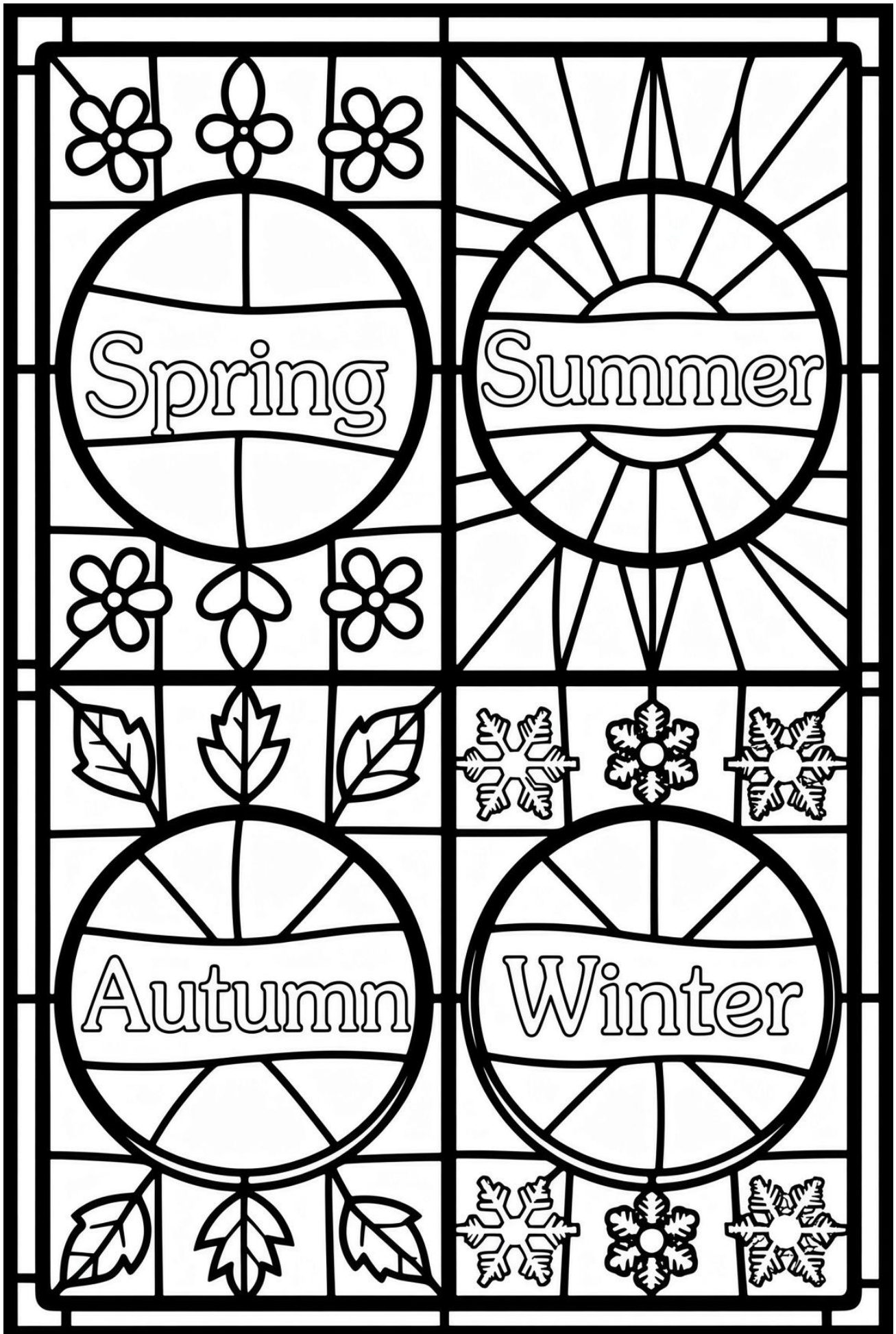
On the next pages, color in each panel with the colors that predominate in nature during that season:

Winter: white, icy blue, and cool jewel tones like sapphire blue, hunter green, and ruby red

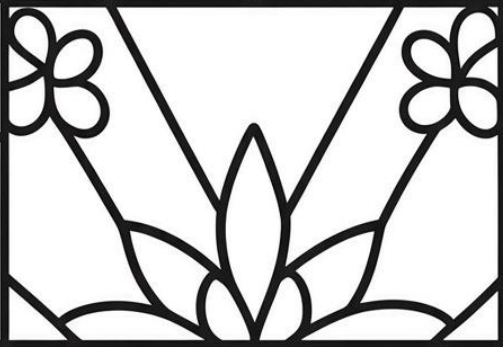
